13:25-13:40 Keynote speech | Overcoming fragmentation in impact investing

Fragmentation in impact investing refers to the lack of standardization in frameworks, data verification, and performance measurement, making it difficult for investors to compare results and scale their impact effectively. As the market matures, differences between large and small investors, regulatory complexities, and the rise of AI further widen these gaps. This conversation explores how fragmentation affects decision-making, why investors report satisfaction despite unmet targets, and what solutions—such as impact benchmarks and improved data-sharing—can drive greater cohesion. We discuss practical strategies to enhance transparency, accountability, and collaboration in the impact investing ecosystem.
